## Motor Traffic Regulations<sup>1</sup> (Amendment)

Subordinate Law No. 34 of 1993<sup>2</sup>

### **Principal Regulations**

**1.** In these Regulations, "Principal Regulations" means the Motor Traffic Regulations.

#### Commencement

2. These Regulations commence on the day on which they are notified in the *Gazette*.

#### Prescribed offences and prescribed penalties

**3.** Regulation 32 of the Principal Regulations is amended—

- (a) by omitting from subparagraphs (b) (i) and (ii) "a Part" and substituting "Part 1 or 2"; and
- (b) by adding at the end the following subregulations:

"(2) For the purposes of Part X of the Act, the prescribed penalty in relation to a parking infringement against a provision of the Act specified in Column 1 of Part III of the Schedule is that specified in Column 3 of that Part of the Schedule opposite the reference to that provision.

"(3) Where a provision of the Act referred to in subregulation (2) is specified more than once in Column 1 of Part III of the Schedule, the prescribed penalty is that specified in Column 3 of that Part opposite the reference to that provision in Column 1 of that Part ascertained by reference to the description of the alleged conduct in Column 2 of that Part.

"(4) For the purposes of paragraph 26A (f) of the *Motor Traffic (Alcohol and Drugs) Act 1977*, the prescribed penalty in relation to an offence against a provision of that Act specified in Column 1 of Part IV of the Schedule is that specified in Column 3 of that Part opposite the reference to that provision.

"(5) For the purposes of section 6D of the *Traffic Act 1937*, the prescribed penalty in relation to an offence against a provision of that Act specified in Column 1 of Part V of the Schedule is that specified in Column 3 of that Part opposite the reference to that provision.".

#### Substitution

**4.** The Schedule to the Principal Regulations is repealed and the following Schedule substituted:
