## About this republication

### The republished law

This is a republication of the *Smoke-free Areas (Enclosed Public Places) Regulations 1994*, made under the *Smoke-free Areas (Enclosed Public Places) Act 1994* as in force on 21 January 2002. It includes any amendment, repeal or expiry affecting the republished law to 12 September 2001 and any amendment made under the *Legislation Act 2001*, part 11.3 (Editorial changes).

The legislation history and amendment history of the republished law are set out in endnotes 3 and 4.

### Kinds of republications

The Parliamentary Counsel's Office prepares 2 kinds of republications of ACT laws (see the ACT legislation register at [www.legislation.act.gov.au](http://www.legislation.act.gov.au)):

- authorised republications to which the *Legislation Act 2001* applies
- unauthorised republications.

The status of this republication appears on the bottom of each page.

### Editorial changes

The *Legislation Act 2001*, part 11.3 authorises the Parliamentary Counsel to make editorial amendments and other changes of a formal nature when preparing a law for republication. Editorial changes do not change the effect of the law, but have effect as if they had been made by an Act commencing on the republication date (see *Legislation Act 2001*, s 115 and s 117). The changes are made if the Parliamentary Counsel considers they are desirable to bring the law into line, or more closely into line, with current legislative drafting practice.

This republication includes amendments made under part 11.3 (see endnote 1).

### Uncommenced provisions and amendments

If a provision of the republished law has not commenced or is affected by an uncommenced amendment, the symbol **U** appears immediately before the provision heading. The text of the uncommenced provision or amendment appears only in the last endnote.

### Modifications

If a provision of the republished law is affected by a current modification, the symbol **M** appears immediately before the provision heading. The text of the modifying provision appears in the endnotes. For the legal status of modifications, see *Legislation Act 2001*, section 95.

### Penalties

The value of a penalty unit for an offence against this republished law at the republication date—

- (a) if the person charged is an individual—\$100; or
- (b) if the person charged is a corporation—\$500.

**1 Name of regulations**

These regulations are the *Smoke-free Areas (Enclosed Public Places) Regulations 1994*.

**3 Meaning of *smoking prohibited symbol***

In these regulations:

*smoking prohibited symbol* means the symbol designated in Australian Standard 2899.1—1986 to indicate where smoking is prohibited.

*Note* A definition applies except so far as the contrary intention appears (see *Legislation Act 2001*, s 155).

**4 Prescribed signs and manner of display**

- (1) For the Act, section 14 (3) a prescribed sign is a sign that—
  - (a) contains—
    - (i) the phrase ‘no smoking’, ‘smoking prohibited’ or ‘smoke-free zone’ in letters that are at least 20mm in height; or
    - (ii) the smoking prohibited symbol with a diameter of at least 70mm; or
    - (iii) other words or symbols that indicate clearly that smoking is prohibited; and
  - (b) indicates clearly where smoking is prohibited.
- (2) For the Act, section 14 (3) the prescribed manner of displaying signs within a place is—
  - (a) in such numbers; and
  - (b) in positions of such prominence;

that such a sign is likely to be seen by a person at a public entrance to, or within, the place.

- (3) Subregulations (1) and (2) do not apply in relation to an enclosed public place if—
- (a) persons within the place could reasonably be expected to know, by custom or otherwise, that smoking is not permitted in the place; and
  - (b) persons do not usually smoke in the place.

## **5 Signs citing Act**

An occupier of an enclosed public place shall not, without reasonable excuse, display within that place a sign—

- (a) indicating that smoking is prohibited; and
- (b) that includes a reference to the Act;

unless smoking is prohibited under the Act in that place.

Maximum penalty:

- (a) if the offender is a natural person—\$500; or
- (b) if the offender is a body corporate—\$2,500.

## **6 Prescribed places where smoking allowed**

For the Act, section 5 (4) (b) a place mentioned in schedule 1 is prescribed in the circumstances mentioned in the schedule for the place.

## **Schedule 1      Places exempted in certain circumstances**

(see reg 6)

<b>column 1 item</b>	<b>column 2 place</b>	<b>column 3 circumstance</b>
1	an area in a building occupied by the University of Canberra that is designated in writing by the Vice-Chancellor of the university as a place where research may be carried out into the effects of smoking	if all the persons taking part in the research are at least 18 years old and the building has equipment that will prevent air moving from the designated area to another area occupied by the university where smoking is not allowed
2	enclosed car parks	if the car park is fitted with equipment that can maintain air quality in accordance with Australian Standard 1668.2.

### 1 About the endnotes

Amending and modifying laws are annotated in the legislation history and the amendment history. Current modifications are not included in the republished law but are set out in the endnotes.

Not all editorial amendments made under the *Legislation Act 2001*, part 11.3 are annotated in the amendment history. Full details of any amendments can be obtained from the Parliamentary Counsel's Office.

Uncommenced amending laws are listed in the legislation history and the amendment history. These details are underlined. Uncommenced provisions and amendments are not included in the republished law but are set out in the last endnotes.

If all the provisions of the law have been renumbered, a table of renumbered provisions gives details of previous and current numbering.

The endnotes also include a table of earlier republications.

If the republished law includes penalties, current information about penalty unit values appears on the republication inside front cover.
