## About this republication

#### The republished law

This is a republication of the *Residential Tenancies Regulations 1998*, made under the *Residential Tenancies Act 1997*, as in force on 27 June 2002. It includes any amendment, repeal or expiry affecting the republished law to 12 September 2001 and any amendment made under the *Legislation Act 2001*, part 11.3 (Editorial changes).

The legislation history and amendment history of the republished law are set out in endnotes 3 and 4.

#### Kinds of republications

The Parliamentary Counsel's Office prepares 2 kinds of republications of ACT laws (see the ACT legislation register at www.legislation.act.gov.au):

- authorised republications to which the Legislation Act 2001 applies
- unauthorised republications.

The status of this republication appears on the bottom of each page.

#### **Editorial changes**

The *Legislation Act 2001*, part 11.3 authorises the Parliamentary Counsel to make editorial amendments and other changes of a formal nature when preparing a law for republication. Editorial changes do not change the effect of the law, but have effect as if they had been made by an Act commencing on the republication date (see *Legislation Act 2001*, s 115 and s 117). The changes are made if the Parliamentary Counsel considers they are desirable to bring the law into line, or more closely into line, with current legislative drafting practice.

This republication includes amendments made under part 11.3 (see endnote 1).

#### Uncommenced provisions and amendments

If a provision of the republished law has not commenced or is affected by an uncommenced amendment, the symbol  $\boxed{U}$  appears immediately before the provision heading. The text of the uncommenced provision or amendment appears only in the last endnote.

#### Modifications

If a provision of the republished law is affected by a current modification, the symbol M appears immediately before the provision heading. The text of the modifying provision appears in the endnotes. For the legal status of modifications, see *Legislation Act 2001*, section 95.

#### **Penalties**

The value of a penalty unit for an offence against this republished law at the republication date is—

- (a) if the person charged is an individual—\$100; or
- (b) if the person charged is a corporation—\$500.

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# **Residential Tenancies Regulations** 1998

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# 1 Name of regulations

These regulations are the Residential Tenancies Regulations 1998.

## 4 Interest

For the Act, section 28 (1) (b) the purposes referred to in the Act, section 28 (2) (a) to (e) are prescribed.

# 5 Service of termination notice

For the Act, sections 58 (1) (b) and 59 (1) (b) a termination notice shall be served—

- (a) on an individual—
  - (i) by delivering it to the person personally; or
  - (ii) by leaving it at, or sending it by prepaid post to, the address of the place of residence or business of the person last known to the person serving the document; or
  - (iii) by leaving it at, or sending it by prepaid post to, the address for service provided by the person under the prescribed terms, clause 98; or
- (b) on a body corporate—by leaving it at, or sending it by prepaid post to, the head office, a registered office or a principal office of the body corporate.

# 6 Application for resolution of dispute

For the Act, section 73 (2) (b) the following particulars are prescribed:

- (a) the name and address of the applicant;
- (b) whether the applicant is the lessor or tenant;
- (c) the address of the premises that are the subject of the residential tenancy agreement;

- (d) the action sought by the applicant to be taken to facilitate the resolution of the dispute;
- (e) the grounds on which the application is made.

## 7 Beginning and record of mediation

- (1) An approved mediator to whom a tenancy dispute is referred under the Act, section 75 shall—
  - (a) begin mediation of the dispute as soon as practicable after the referral; and
  - (b) keep a record of the mediation that contains the following particulars:
    - (i) whether the parties to the dispute participated in mediation;
    - (ii) whether the parties reached agreement;
    - (iii) if the parties reached agreement, with the written consent of the parties—the terms of the agreement.
- (2) At the conclusion of mediation the approved mediator shall provide the record referred to in subregulation (1) (b) to the registrar.

Not all editorial amendments made under the *Legislation Act 2001*, part 11.3 are annotated in the amendment history. Full details of any amendments can be obtained from the Parliamentary Counsel's Office.

Uncommenced amending laws and expiries are listed in the legislation history and the amendment history. These details are underlined. Uncommenced provisions and amendments are not included in the republished law but are set out in the last endnote.

If all the provisions of the law have been renumbered, a table of renumbered provisions gives details of previous and current numbering.

The endnotes also include a table of earlier republications.

If the republished law includes penalties, current information about penalty unit values appears on the republication inside front cover.
