Kinds of republications

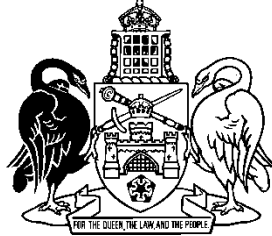
The Parliamentary Counsel's Office prepares 2 kinds of republications of ACT laws (see the ACT legislation register at www.legislation.act.gov.au):

Editorial changes

The *Legislation (Republication) Act 1996*, part 3, division 2 authorised the Parliamentary Counsel to make editorial amendments and other changes of a formal nature when preparing a law for republication. Editorial changes do not change the effect of the law, but have effect as if they had been made by an Act commencing on the republication date (see *Legislation (Republication) Act 1996*, s 14 and s 16). The changes are made if the Parliamentary Counsel considers they are desirable to bring the law into line, or more closely into line, with current legislative drafting practice.

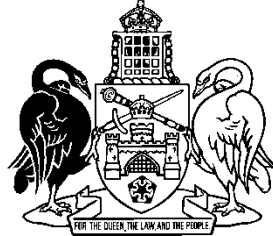

1 Name of regulations

These regulations are the *Animal Diseases (Bees) Regulations 2000*.

2 Commencement

These regulations commence on the commencement of the *Animal Diseases (Amendment) Act 1999*.

3 Definitions

In these regulations, the following definitions apply unless the contrary intention appears:

broodbox means the bottom box of an active beehive.

frame hive means a beehive that—

- (a) contains only moveable frames that are capable of being readily and separately removed for examination; or
- (b) contains—
 - (i) fixed frames in all honey super-boxes of the beehive; and
 - (ii) only moveable frames, that are capable of being readily and separately removed for examination, in the broodbox of the beehive; and

- (iii) a device fitted immediately above the broodbox of the beehive that excludes the queen bee from all honey super-boxes of the beehive.

honey super-box means an upper box of a beehive in which honey is stored.

4 Honey bees to be kept in frame hives

A person must not keep honey bees other than in a frame hive.

Maximum penalty: 10 penalty units.

5 Honey not to be exposed

A person must not expose honey or honeycomb, other than in a frame hive, in a way that honey bees may have access to it.

Maximum penalty: 10 penalty units.

ENDNOTES

1 About this republication

This is a republication of the *Animal Diseases (Bees) Regulations 2000* as in force under the *Animal Diseases Act 1993* on 2 March 2000. The regulations had not been amended up to that date.

Amending laws are annotated in the table of legislation and table of amendments.

The Parliamentary Counsel's Office currently prepares 2 kinds of republications of ACT laws: authorised printed republications to which the *Legislation (Republication) Act 1996* applies and unauthorised electronic republications. The status of this republication appears on the cover.

Section 13 of the *Legislation (Republication) Act 1996* authorises the Parliamentary Counsel, in preparing a law for republication, to make textual amendments of a formal nature which the Parliamentary Counsel considers desirable in accordance with current legislative drafting practice. The amendments do not effect a substantive change in the law.

In preparing this republication, amendments have not been made under section 13.

Not all amendments made under section 13 are annotated in the table of amendments. Full details of any amendments can be obtained from the Parliamentary Counsel's Office.
