The republished law

This is a republication of the *Children and Young People Regulations 2000* effective from 23 October 2000 to 11 September 2001.

Kinds of republications

- authorised republications to which the *Legislation Act 2001* applies
- unauthorised republications.

Editorial changes

The *Legislation (Republication) Act 1996*, part 3, division 2 authorised the Parliamentary Counsel to make editorial amendments and other changes of a formal nature when preparing a law for republication. Editorial changes do not change the effect of the law, but have effect as if they had been made by an Act commencing on the republication date (see *Legislation (Republication) Act 1996*, s 14 and s 16). The changes are made if the Parliamentary Counsel considers they are desirable to bring the law into line, or more closely into line, with current legislative drafting practice.

1 Name of regulations

These regulations are the *Children and Young People Regulations 2000*.

3 Definition

In these regulations:

the Act means the *Children and Young People Act 1999*.

4 Agreements—prescribed States

For subsection 133 (2) of the Act, the following States are declared to have enacted legislation dealing with the interstate transfer of young offenders:

- (a) New South Wales;
- (b) Victoria;
- (c) Queensland.

5 Prescribed form—s 175

An application to register an agreement under section 175 (which deals with registration of family group conference agreements) of the Act must—

- (a) ask that the agreement be registered; and

- (b) list anyone who took part in the conference but did not sign the agreement.

6 Prescribed form—s 270

An application for a warrant under section 270 (which deals with warrants for taking a child or young person into safe custody) of the Act must—

- (a) state the name of the applicant; and
- (b) describe the order that has been contravened; and
- (c) describe the situation that has led to the making of the application.

ENDNOTES

1 About this republication

This is a republication of the *Children and Young People Regulations 2000* as in force under the *Children and Young People Act 1999* on 23 October 2000. The regulations had not been amended up to that date.

Amending laws are annotated in the table of legislation and table of amendments.

The Parliamentary Counsel's Office currently prepares 2 kinds of republications of ACT laws: authorised printed republications to which the *Legislation (Republication) Act 1996* applies and unauthorised electronic republications. The status of this republication appears on the cover.

Section 13 of the *Legislation (Republication) Act 1996* authorises the Parliamentary Counsel, in preparing a law for republication, to make textual amendments of a formal nature which the Parliamentary Counsel considers desirable in accordance with current legislative drafting practice. The amendments do not effect a substantive change in the law.

In preparing this republication, amendments have been made under section 13.

Not all amendments made under section 13 are annotated in the table of amendments. Full details of any amendments can be obtained from the Parliamentary Counsel's Office.
