About this republication

The republished law

This is a republication of the *Fisheries Regulations 2001*, made under the *Fisheries Act 2000* as in force on 12 September 2001. It includes any commencement, amendment, repeal or expiry affecting the republished law up to 30 August 2001 and any amendment made under the *Legislation Act 2001*, part 11.3 (Editorial changes).

The legislation history and amendment history of the republished law are set out in endnotes 3 and 4.

Kinds of republications

The Parliamentary Counsel's Office prepares 2 kinds of republications of ACT laws (see the ACT legislation register at www.legislation.act.gov.au):

- authorised republications to which the *Legislation Act 2001* applies
- unauthorised republications.

The status of this republication appears on the bottom of each page.

Editorial amendments

The *Legislation Act 2001*, part 11.3 authorises the Parliamentary Counsel to make editorial amendments and other changes of a formal nature when preparing a law for republication. Editorial changes do not change the effect of the law, but have effect as if they had been made by an Act commencing on the republication date (see *Legislation Act 2001*, s 115 and s 117). The changes are made if the Parliamentary Counsel considers they are desirable to bring the law into line, or more closely into line, with current legislative drafting practice.

This republication includes amendments made under part 11.3 (see endnote 1).

Uncommenced provisions and amendments

If a provision of the republished law has not commenced or is affected by an uncommenced amendment, the symbol **U** appears immediately before the provision heading. The text of the uncommenced provision or amendment appears only in the last endnote.

Modifications

If a provision of the republished law is affected by a current modification, the symbol **M** appears immediately before the provision heading. The text of the modifying provision appears in the endnotes. For the legal status of modifications, see *Legislation Act 2001*, section 95.

Penalties

The value of a penalty unit for an offence against this republished law at the republication date—

- (a) if the person charged is an individual—\$100; or
- (b) if the person charged is a corporation—\$500.

1 Name of regulations

These regulations are the *Fisheries Regulations 2001*.

3 Prescribed number of fish—Act, s 37 (1)

For the Act, section 37 (1) (Fish dealers to be registered), the number of fish prescribed for any period is zero.

4 Prescribed quantity of fish—Act, s 45 (1)

For the Act, section 45 (1) (Sale of fish by commercial fishers), the quantity of fish prescribed is 0kg.

5 Hoop nets

If the Minister declares, under the Act, section 17 (Declaration of fishing gear), that hoop nets are fishing gear that may be used for taking fish (or a particular kind of fish), a person must not use a hoop net other than by lowering it into the water and drawing it out by hand vertically.

Maximum penalty: 5 penalty units.

6 Infringement notice offences—Act, s 90, def of *infringement notice offence*

An infringement notice offence is an offence against a provision of the Act or these regulations mentioned in schedule 1, column 2.

7 Infringement notice penalties—Act, s 90, def of *infringement notice penalty*

- (1) The penalty payable by an individual under an infringement notice for an infringement notice offence is the amount mentioned in schedule 1, column 3 of the item applying to the offence.
- (2) The penalty payable by a corporation under an infringement notice for an infringement notice offence is 5 times the amount mentioned in schedule 1, column 3 of the item applying to the offence.

**8 Cost of serving reminder notice—Act, s 90, def of
infringement notice penalty, par (b)**

The cost of serving a reminder notice for an infringement notice offence is \$34.
