1 Name of regulations

These regulations are the *Road Transport (Third-Party Insurance) Amendment Regulations 2003 (No 1)*.

2 Commencement

These regulations commence on the day after their notification day.

Note The naming and commencement provisions automatically commence on the notification day (see Legislation Act, s 75 (1)).

3 Regulations amended

These regulations amend the *Road Transport (Third-Party Insurance) Regulations 2000*.

4 New regulation 14

insert

14 Policies beginning before 1 July 2003

- (1) Schedule 1, as in force immediately before the commencement of this regulation, continues to apply to a third-party policy that is expressed to begin before 1 July 2003.
- (2) This regulation expires on 1 July 2003.
