About this republication

The republished law

This is a republication of the *Magistrates Court (Litter Infringement Notices) Regulations 2004*, made under the *Magistrates Court Act 1930* (including any amendment made under the *Legislation Act 2001*, part 11.3 (Editorial changes)) as in force on 30 September 2004. It also includes any commencement, repeal or expiry affecting the republished law.

The legislation history and amendment history of the republished law are set out in endnotes 3 and 4.

Kinds of republications

The Parliamentary Counsel's Office prepares 2 kinds of republications of ACT laws (see the ACT legislation register at www.legislation.act.gov.au):

- authorised republications to which the *Legislation Act 2001* applies
- unauthorised republications.

The status of this republication appears on the bottom of each page.

Editorial amendments

The *Legislation Act 2001*, part 11.3 authorises the Parliamentary Counsel to make editorial amendments and other changes of a formal nature when preparing a law for republication. Editorial changes do not change the effect of the law, but have effect as if they had been made by an Act commencing on the republication date (see *Legislation Act 2001*, s 115 and s 117). The changes are made if the Parliamentary Counsel considers they are desirable to bring the law into line, or more closely into line, with current legislative drafting practice.

This republication does not include amendments made under part 11.3 (see endnote 1).

Uncommenced provisions and amendments

If a provision of the republished law has not commenced or is affected by an uncommenced amendment, the symbol **U** appears immediately before the provision heading. The text of the uncommenced provision or amendment appears only in the last endnote.

Modifications

If a provision of the republished law is affected by a current modification, the symbol **M** appears immediately before the provision heading. The text of the modifying provision appears in the endnotes. For the legal status of modifications, see *Legislation Act 2001*, section 95.

Penalties

The value of a penalty unit for an offence against this republished law at the republication date is—

- (a) if the person charged is an individual—\$100; or
- (b) if the person charged is a corporation—\$500.

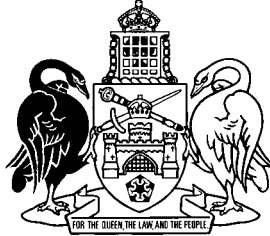

1 Name of regulations

These regulations are the *Magistrates Court (Litter Infringement Notices) Regulations 2004*.

3 Purpose of regulations

The purpose of these regulations is to provide for infringement notices under the *Magistrates Court Act 1930*, part 8 for certain offences against the Litter Act.

Note The *Magistrates Court Act 1930*, pt 8 provides a system of infringement notices for offences against various Acts. The infringement notice system is intended to provide an alternative to prosecution.

4 Notes

A note included in these regulations is explanatory and is not part of these regulations.

Note See Legislation Act, s 127 (1), (4) and (5) for the legal status of notes.

5 Meaning of *Litter Act*

In these regulations:

Litter Act means the *Litter Act 2004*.

6 Administering authority

The administering authority for an infringement notice offence against the Litter Act is the chief executive for the Litter Act.

7 Infringement notice offences

The *Magistrates Court Act 1930*, part 8 applies to an offence against a provision of the Litter Act mentioned in schedule 1, column 2.

8 Infringement notice penalties

- (1) The penalty payable by an individual for an offence against the Litter Act, under an infringement notice for the offence, is the amount mentioned in schedule 1, column 4 for the offence.
- (2) The penalty payable by a corporation for an offence against the Litter Act, under an infringement notice for the offence, is 5 times the amount mentioned in schedule 1, column 4 for the offence.
- (3) The cost of serving a reminder notice for an infringement notice offence against the Litter Act is \$34.

9 Contents of infringement notices—other information

- (1) An infringement notice served on a company by an authorised person for an infringement notice offence against the Litter Act must include the company's ACN.

Note The requirement under this regulation is additional to the requirement under the *Magistrates Court Act 1930*, s 121 (1) (c).

- (2) In this regulation:

company means a company registered under the Corporations Act.

10 Contents of infringement notices—identifying authorised person

An infringement notice served on a person by an authorised person for an infringement notice offence against the Litter Act must identify the authorised person—

- (a) by—
 - (i) the authorised person's full name, or surname and initials; and
 - (ii) the position held by the authorised person as it appears on the authorised person's identity card; or

- (b) by any unique number given, for these regulations, to the authorised person by the administering authority.

11 Contents of reminder notices—identifying authorised person

A reminder notice served on a person by an authorised person for an infringement notice offence against the Litter Act must identify the authorised person—

- (a) by—
 - (i) the authorised person’s full name, or surname and initials; and
 - (ii) the position held by the authorised person as it appears on the authorised person’s identity card; or
- (b) by any unique number given, for these regulations, to the authorised person by the administering authority.

12 Service of notices by authorised people

An authorised person under the Litter Act, section 14 may serve—

- (a) an infringement notice for an infringement notice offence against the Litter Act; and
- (b) a reminder notice for an infringement notice offence against the Litter Act.
