About this republication

The republished law

This is a republication of the *Children and Young People (Transitional Provisions) Regulation* 2009, made under the *Children and Young People Act* 2008 (including any amendment made under the *Legislation Act* 2001, part 11.3 (Editorial changes)) as in force on 27 February 2009. It also includes any commencement, repeal or expiry affecting the republished law.

The legislation history and amendment history of the republished law are set out in endnotes 3 and 4.

Kinds of republications

The Parliamentary Counsel's Office prepares 2 kinds of republications of ACT laws (see the ACT legislation register at www.legislation.act.gov.au):

- authorised republications to which the Legislation Act 2001 applies
- unauthorised republications.

The status of this republication appears on the bottom of each page.

Editorial amendments

The *Legislation Act 2001*, part 11.3 authorises the Parliamentary Counsel to make editorial amendments and other changes of a formal nature when preparing a law for republication. Editorial changes do not change the effect of the law, but have effect as if they had been made by an Act commencing on the republication date (see *Legislation Act 2001*, s 115 and s 117). The changes are made if the Parliamentary Counsel considers they are desirable to bring the law into line, or more closely into line, with current legislative drafting practice.

This republication does not include amendments made under part 11.3 (see endnote 1).

Uncommenced provisions and amendments

If a provision of the republished law has not commenced or is affected by an uncommenced amendment, the symbol \boxed{U} appears immediately before the provision heading. The text of the uncommenced provision or amendment appears only in the last endnote.

Modifications

If a provision of the republished law is affected by a current modification, the symbol $\boxed{\mathbf{M}}$ appears immediately before the provision heading. The text of the modifying provision appears in the endnotes. For the legal status of modifications, see *Legislation Act 2001*, section 95.

Penalties

The value of a penalty unit for an offence against this republished law at the republication date is—

- (a) if the person charged is an individual—\$100; or
- (b) if the person charged is a corporation—\$500.

1 Name of regulation

This regulation is the *Children and Young People (Transitional Provisions) Regulation 2009.*

3 Employment of children and young people—Act, s 894 (1)

- (1) Despite the repeal of the *Children and Young People Act 1999* (the *repealed Act*)—
 - (a) the repealed Act, chapter 10 (Employment of children and young people) continues to apply, with any necessary changes, in relation to a child or young person; and
 - (b) the repealed Act, section 384 (1) (j) and (k) continues to apply to a decision of the chief executive as if the reference in section 384 to an application to the administrative appeals tribunal for a review of the decision were a reference to an application to the ACAT, and with any necessary changes.
- (2) To remove any doubt, the principles applying in relation to a child or young person under the repealed Act, part 2.2 (Principles applying to the Act) continue to apply in relation to the making of a decision or the taking of action under the repealed Act, chapter 10 in relation to a child or young person.
- (3) The Legislation Act, section 88 (Repeal does not end effect of transitional laws etc) does not apply to this section.

4 Modification of Act, ch 27—Act, s 894 (2)

The Act, section 969, definition of *repealed Act* applies as if it read as follows:

'repealed Act means the *Children and Young People Act 1999*, as in force immediately before its repeal.

5 Expiry

- (1) Section 3 expires on the commencement of the Act, chapter 21.
- (2) The remainder of this regulation expires on the expiry of the Act, part 27.7.

Note The application of the repealed Act, ch 10 (Employment of children and young people) is continued (see the *Children and Young People* (*Transitional Provisions*) *Regulation 2009*, s 3).'
