# 1 Name of regulation

This regulation is the *Medicines, Poisons and Therapeutic Goods Amendment Regulation 2010 (No 5).* 

### 2 Commencement

This regulation commences on the day after its notification day.

*Note* The naming and commencement provisions automatically commence on the notification day (see Legislation Act, s 75 (1)).

### 3 Legislation amended

This regulation amends the *Medicines, Poisons and Therapeutic Goods Regulation 2008*.

# 4 Section 30 (1) (c) (i)

(i) the person is not a trainee dentist, trainee nurse practitioner, intern doctor or person training to be an eligible midwife; or

(a) a dentist, doctor, eligible midwife, nurse practitioner, optometrist, podiatrist or veterinary surgeon;

insert

(4) In this section:

public employee includes a police officer.

		(e)	supply medicines to which par (d) applies to patients during consultations if labelled in accordance with s 161;
		(f)	administer medicines to which par (d) applies in accordance with prescription issued by themself;
