Associations Incorporation Amendment Bill 2009

A Bill for

An Act to amend the *Associations Incorporation Act 1991*, and for other purposes

The Legislative Assembly for the Australian Capital Territory enacts as follows:

1 **1 Name of Act**

2 This Act is the *Associations Incorporation Amendment Act 2009*.

3 **2 Commencement**

4 This Act commences on the day after its notification day.

5 *Note* The naming and commencement provisions automatically commence on
6 the notification day (see Legislation Act, s 75 (1)).

7 **3 Legislation amended**

8 This Act amends the *Associations Incorporation Act 1991*.

9 *Note* This Act also amends the *Associations Incorporation Regulation 1991*
10 (see s 10).

11 **4 Inspection of documents**
12 **Section 11 (1), new note 2**

14 *Note 2* A person cannot inspect or obtain a copy of another person's address
15 that is contained in a lodged document if the other person has asked for
16 their address to be kept confidential under s 13A.

17 **5 New section 13A**

18 *in part 2, insert*

19 **13A Addresses may be kept confidential**

20 (1) This section applies to a document that is or has been lodged with
21 the registrar-general under this Act.

22 (2) A person whose address is contained in the document may ask the
23 registrar-general, in writing, to keep the person's address
24 confidential.

25 *Note* If a form is approved under s 126 (Approved forms) for a request, the
26 form must be used.

1 (3) If a person makes a request under subsection (2), the
2 registrar-general must ensure that any document the subject of the
3 request is made available for inspection under section 11 only in a
4 way that does not show the person's address.

5 (4) However, a person who is the public officer of an incorporated
6 association must have at least 1 address available for inspection
7 under section 11.

8 *Note* A public officer's address may be a residential, business or PO box
9 address.
