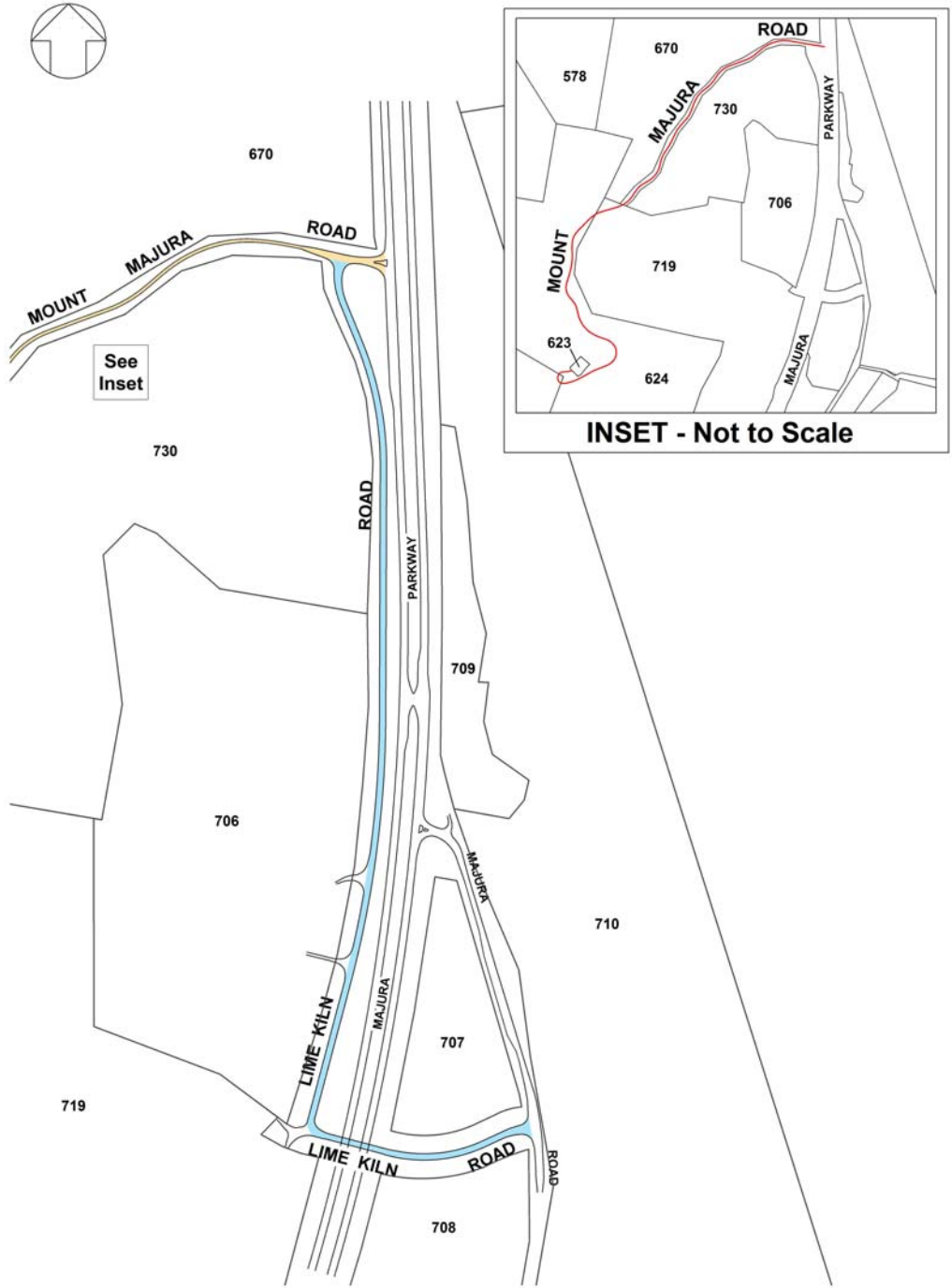

NAME	ORIGIN	SIGNIFICANCE
Lime Kiln Road	'Lime Kiln' historical property name.	Property name associated with the locality The property of the "Majura Cameron's" on Portion 40 Parish of Pialligo was known as 'Lime Kiln' or 'Limekilns'. Oral and documentary place names suggest that there was a kiln located on Portion 40. Portion 40 was surveyed as 'Limekiln Station' in 1864 and as the 'Lime Kiln Block' on the c.1915 Federal Territory Feature Map. The map indicates the Portion 40 house as the residence of 'Miss Cameron'. In 1916 the land was resumed from Miss Isabella Cameron for the Federal Territory.
Mount Majura Road	Mount Majura	Local place name The road has been known as the <i>Mount Majura Road</i> since the late 1960s. It was built to provide access to the summit of Mount Majura. The tender for the construction of the access road was advertised in "The Canberra Times" in December 1965. The tender covered the construction of 1.8 miles of road, including formation, drainage, paving and priming.
